#### **From Pastor Michael**

"In my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel." – 2 Corinthians 9:18

I've been hearing a lot about rights lately. In our politics again this week, both sides risk consequences that both know will be harmful to our country to stand on what they think is right. The arguments in our community over masking revolve around individual rights. Even in our Christianity, in the national conversations in our denomination, and even in our own church. People would rather protect their rights than make the compromises that relationship demands.

Contrast this with how the apostle Paul operates. Again and again, on issue after issue, Paul teaches what is right and then gives up his individual rights to do what is best for the community. In 1 Corinthians, he wishes everyone could remain unmarried and celibate, but he makes allowances for those who can't. In Romans he teaches that Christians can eat meat sacrificed to idols (which for most Christians in Rome would mean all meat), but also teaches that they should not do so if the action will cause another person to be confused and to sin against their own conscience. It's a confusing thing for many of us who have grown up in churches that taught that compromise is the first step on the path to hell. Much like the Jewish community from the exile to the time of Paul, any compromise with the surrounding society was viewed courting cultural impurity and the beginning of the end of Jewish identity.

Then Jesus came, teaching and even demanding that the identity of God's people rested on how well we love our neighbors. Not our zealous adherence to one idea of righteousness, not how well we followed a law, but how well we love each other. Jesus' is still a radical idea. It was radical when Paul preached to give up individual rights to eat meat for the community, even more when he gave up his own income. To follow Paul in following Jesus, where can we give up our individual rights to do what is best for the community, both in the church and in our larger neighborhoods?


