Lighting of the Candles

*Call to Worship and Lighting the Advent Candles Isaiah 9:2, 6-7; John 3:16 Leader: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Welcome. We come tonight to celebrate God coming to be with us in Jesus.

People: The people walking in darkness have seen a great light. On those living in a pitch-dark land, light has dawned.

(Light the first candle.)

Leader: We light the candle of hope as a sign of the promises God made through the prophets to come and be with us.

People: A child is born to us, a son is given to us! Authority will be on his shoulders. He is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.

(Light the second candle.)

Leader: We light the candle of peace as a sign of forgiveness and new relationships with God and with each other in the reign of God on earth.

People: His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for David's throne and for his kingdom. He will establish and sustain it with justice and righteousness now and forever.

(Light the third candle.)

Leader: We light the candle of joy as a sign that God lifts up the weak and the hurting, the poor and the weary.

People: The passion of the Lord of hosts will do this.

(Light the fourth candle.)

Leader: We light the candle of love as a sign that God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that everyone who believes in him will have eternal life.

All: Christ is born. Alleluia!

Opening Prayer of Confession

All: Merciful God, we confess that we have not loved you with our whole heart. We have failed to be an obedient church. We have not done your will, we have rebelled against your love, we have not loved our neighbors, and we have not heard the cry of the needy. Forgive us, we pray. Free us for joyful obedience, through Jesus Christ our Lord. (silence for personal prayer)

Leader: The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to us all. In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven!

People: In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven.

All: Glory to God, Amen.

Leader: As a forgiven and reconciled people, let us pass God's peace with each other. The peace of Christ be with you.

People: And also with you.
