From Pastor Michael

"Wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." - Matthew 2:1b-2

As I write this, the church worldwide observes Epiphany, the twelfth day of the Christmas Season, when we remember the visit of the wise men to Jesus and his family. The point of this story is that very early on, God was revealing that Jesus was a savior for everyone. In fact, in the early days of the church, the Nativity (or birth), the Epiphany, and the Baptism of Jesus were all celebrated together in one season, finished by the Transfiguration, as the progressive relation of Jesus as Son of God and savior of the world. It is only in relatively recent times (given our 2000 year history) that the church has privileged the birth of Jesus above the other revelations.

You can get hints that the Jewish Messiah is coming as savior of the world all the way back to God's promises to Abraham in Genesis and certainly in the prophets. Yet there is just as much scripture to indicate that God's coming salvation would be for the righteous Jews and would be God's wrath upon the Gentiles (everyone else). Just take Zechariah 9:15 referring to the enemies of Israel, "They shall drink their blood like wine, and be full like a bowl, drenched like the corners of the altar." The early church (who were all Jews) struggled to understand how it could be that the blessings of the Jewish Messiah could be poured out on Gentiles. Most of the rest of the New Testament after the Gospels is dealing with this problem in one way or another. So it was that Epiphany, or the revelation of Jesus as the savior of the whole world became a very important holi-day to celebrate in the church.

I think that recovering some of this early amazement and celebration that Jesus comes as the light of the world would be helpful to the church in our current age of division and schism. Can we join with the early believers to be, "Astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit has been poured out even on..." them? As one of my sister's patients said, "Can you believe it? Some people in my church are...Democrats!" Yet, Democrats or Trump-ites, Catholics or Latter-Day Saints, poor or rich, none of these are as strange to us as these wise men would have been to Mary and Joseph. None of these could be farther from acceptable to Jews than these Gentiliest of the Gentiles, pig-eaters, astronomers, worshippers of foreign deities. Yet Mary and Joseph remembered their worship of Jesus, the strange gifts they gave for a king and for a corpse, and the story they told about the star that shined out to all the world since Jesus' birth. And Mary and Joseph told their story to future generations, later written down by Matthew, as an example for the whole church, that God is moving and working among those we would least expect, those we would most wish to exclude, those who seem least likely to be acceptable to Jesus. For Jesus is the light of the world.




From the Office
