Holy Week Explained

Every year in the week before Easter Sunday, our church and most other liturgical churches celebrate Holy Week. In this time, we remember events in the last week of Jesus' life during his time in Jerusalem for the Passover celebration. While there are a few differences between the timeline of Holy Week represented in the synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) and the Gospel according to John, the worship services that we hold represent ancient and ecumenical tradition for remembering the various events. First, we celebrate Palm Sunday, remembering Jesus' arrival into Jerusalem. We waive palm branches and sometimes have a large outdoor procession to reenact the way his followers and the people hailed him as king as he came to town riding on a donkey. In the ancient tradition, this celebration would stand on its own, assuming that the congregation would return for the other services during the week. However, given the reality of low attendance for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, we do not want people to go from "mini-Easter" to Easter without having to travel with Jesus to the cross. So, in our celebration, the mood turns somber during the service in a deliberate effort to bring the congregation to remember that before resurrection came suffering and death.

Although some churches, like St. Andrews down the street will have worship every day during Holy Week, we choose to remember only the most significant moments. Next, we worship on Maundy (the Latin for Commandment) Thursday, remembering the Last Supper Jesus hosted in the Upper Room on the night he was betrayed by Judas Iscariot. Traditionally, worshippers will share in communion, and a foot washing ceremony to remember that Jesus commanded his disciples to continue doing both. This service is the beginning of three days of worship, known as the Triduum (the Great Three Days). The worship ends with a stripping of the altar, removing all elements of adornment to remind us that Christ went to the cross stripped and alone. Because we will be worshiping at Northside UMC for Maundy Thursday, we will strip our altar at the end of the Palm Sunday worship. We will not have a foot washing. The worship will not have a benediction and the worship on Good Friday will not have a call to worship, indicating that they are one continuous worship service.

On Good Friday, we remember that Jesus was taken from the garden where he was praying during the night, brought before the temple leaders early in the morning, and hung on the cross by Friday afternoon. He died relatively quickly for a victim of crucifixion and was laid in a tomb. To worship God while remembering this tragedy helps us to understand why the day is called "Good." Our tradition of reading the Passion story from the Gospel of John while progressively dimming the church through the extinguishing of

candles reflects a reversal of our Christmas Eve service; the light is going out of the world. This Tenebrae (Darkness) service dates to the 9th century. Again, we close worship in silence without benediction; the story is not yet finished. On Holy Saturday, the sabbath day, we rest as Jesus rested in the grave.

On Sunday, we celebrate that Jesus rose from the dead on the third day (Friday being day 1, Saturday day 2). The traditional Easter Vigil begins on Saturday evening (like our Christmas Eve worship); the Jewish new day began at sunset the day before. The service finishes the Great Three Days with light being returned to the church, ten readings of scripture, the first baptisms and the first communion of Easter. The service can be scheduled in the late evening, to end after midnight, or to end at sunrise Sunday morning. It is from this tradition that our sunrise services come. For us, as with many American Protestant churches, we close out Holy Week with our usual Sunday morning service, singing "Christ the Lord is Risen Today" and shouting "Alleluia!" for the first time since Lent began. I invite you this year to not only remember the resurrection, but worship and remember the Passion of our Lord as well to deepen your spirit and faith in preparation for Easter.

Sunday Worship Safety Protocols

We are in person and live-streaming our Sunday Worship Service on Facebook on our page: Saint Paul UMC (Greenville, SC). Join us at 11am as we give praise to our Lord.

We have updated the Safety Protocols as follows:

- 1. Cloth or surgical face masks covering the nose and mouth are optional for all times, places and events. Masks are required for everyone aged 3 and older in the balcony.


