Itinerancy Pros and Cons

According to the Book of Discipline, the organizational doctrine for the United Methodist Church, fully ordained elders are required to make themselves available to itinerate, or move, from church to church at the Bishop's command. Charges (or churches) are therefore required to accept the pastors that are sent by the Bishop. This system is somewhat unique in the church universal because of the frequency of moves and the relatively limited power of the churches and the pastors to decide. Our system may be most similar to the Roman Catholic assignment system, although their priests often stay in a parish much longer. Most other mainline denominations have some version of a call system, where pastors interview with churches and the churches call the pastors to serve.

Our system has several positive aspects. First, in the interplay of congregational and pastoral requests, District needs, and the Bishop's plans, there is liminal space for the Holy Spirit to work. Additionally, the pastors have someone aware of their needs and advocating on their behalf, whereas in a straight call system, each pastor is independent. For the church, the pastor's influence and cult of personality can be limited, requiring each church to build its own identity and mission.

Unfortunately, there are also negative aspects. Churches become jaded by frequent moves and will pull back from forming a meaningful relationship with a new pastor. It becomes hard to risk love when you know the person will leave. In addition, perceived slights by the Bishop cause smaller churches to develop inferiority complexes and stagnation as momentum is disrupted by frequent moves.

As we go through this process now, I invite you to focus on the work of the Holy Spirit in bringing Pastor Matt, and the identity and mission of St. Paul that we have been working to clarify. You can also work hard to embrace him and love on him and his family without fear or resentment. A church needs a pastor; a pastor needs a church; neither are whole without the other.


