The Weirdness of Methodist Goodbyes

This will be my last newsletter article, as June is my final month as your pastor. I'll be saying goodbye in different ways throughout the month, and on July 3, Rev. Matt Greer will join you as your new pastor. And then it gets weird. It's actually a lot like breaking up with a girlfriend that you've been in love with. There are all these shared memories, shared photos, songs and places and restaurants that remind you of each other. When you go cold turkey, complete shut off, you start to wonder, did it ever mean anything at all? How can love just end? That's why so often breakups drag on and on and get messier and messier.

And know this, it did mean something, I do love you, and I hope we can find new ways to be in a relationship that will be healthy for all of us.

Sunday Worship Safety Protocols

We have updated the Safety Protocols as follows:

- 1. Cloth or surgical face masks covering the nose and mouth are optional for all times, places, and events. Masks are required for everyone aged 3 and older in the balcony.

Congratulations to William Searcy, Jr., as he starts his 24th year at the music director for Saint Paul. Thank you for all he has done and all that he continues to do!




JUNE MISSIONS
