## September 2022 Newsletter

August 14th 2022 was a mighty powerful day as our youth gave testimonies of what the Lord did with their summer opportunities through camps, Salkehatchie, and local missions of Saint Paul. Here are some pastor thoughts from the other side of the pulpit:

1) I sat by former pastor, Murray Snow, and his family. I loved the delight they took in this day. It made me think of pastors from my childhood and teenage years that were important to my faith formation. Itinerating is hard, but sitting with the Snows on this particular Sunday reminded me how wonderful it is to have a TEAM OF PASTORS that will love, pray for, and appropriately support you beyond the move. I am thankful for my pastors, and I'm blessed for my turn in the Saint Paul pastor team now.

2) COMMUNITY!!! The most frequently used terms of the day were friends, people, connect, group, relationships, reuniting, and well you get the point right? Each time this theme showed up, it was more and more proof that the generation that is connected to many through technology is still craving and longing for community. May we 1) cultivate community for them to frequently enjoy and 2) be great examples of how to do life in and with community.

3) Multiple talks mentioned COMMUNION being an important aspect of their experiences. I expected to hear about Ga-Ga Ball, Wet Willie, roofing and painting projects. I found the addition of communion to those things to be a lovely confirmation that 2000-year-old ways of worship are still working for all current generations. As the Church always looks forward on how to engage new generations, may it never be at the expense of the good things God has already gifted us with.

4) It got deep! Hinton and Salkehatchie talks went beyond the standard "what we did" but dove into real problems of the world. They spoke of monetary challenges of living in RURAL AREAS, how they negatively affect those already in poverty, and how JUDGEMENT falls upon them. They spoke of the RACISM endured by those they helped. They spoke of how their presence in the homes brought some healing to the loneliness and ISOLATION the homeowners were experiencing. It's easy to see and talk about the brokenness of the houses, but much harder to proclaim the brokenness in our systems and hearts. I'm impressed this was something our youth did!

5) I don't believe the children are the future of the church; I cringe when I hear it. Whatever you want to call them (children, youth, students, young people, kids) there is nothing future about what they are doing RIGHT NOW!!!

## **Rolling along**

St. Paul UMC, Greenville, held a food truck-themed VBS June 12-17, enjoying "VBS Food Truck Party: On a Roll with God." They partnered with Northside UMC again and met at St. Paul UMC, using a hybrid model where the participants each received a bag with crafts and study book to complete at home. They were able to watch the story and song videos on a private Facebook page. Dinner was served each evening. Pink Mama's Ice Cream truck came one night, and all enjoyed ice cream for dessert. The children took part in the opening assembly puppet show with different storytellers each evening, followed by a discussion of the story and how to apply the meaning to daily life. Their mission project was collecting food items for United Ministries, and the offering was used to purchase 21 gift cards for Epworth's Foster Care Program.

Representatives from United Ministries and The Christian Learning Centers of Greenville County joined the St. Paul family for the event to share ways they can walk alongside families to help make this the best school year ever.
